Message from CEO and Board Chair

What was coined as our YMCA of Cape Breton's "RESET PLAN," was in fact a promise to deliver on a short-term strategic plan in 2022/2023. The plan focused on rebounding the organization from the experience and effects of the COVID pandemic, towards a journey of growth, collaboration and a path towards a thriving YMCA.

Strategic priorities in 2022/2023 included delivering our mission through three key areas: sharing our story, increasing opportunities to thrive, and focusing on our people.

Sharing our Story - With a complete revamp of our YMCA of Cape Breton website and the growth of our social media to more than 12,000 followers, we have taken a more proactive approach to sharing our story. We also gathered a guiding team, made a plan, collaborated with stakeholders across Cape Breton Island, and finalized our 2023-2026 YMCA strategic plan. The Association is moving into the next fiscal year with renewed priorities, a renewed mission and a vision for thriving communities where everyone can shine and feel they belong.

Increasing Opportunities to Thrive - We forged ahead with new opportunities to partner and deliver services in employment and childcare across the Island. We secured sites for our additional NS Works sites in four communities, and we worked diligently with YMCAs across Nova Scotia towards the eventual opening of two new childcare centres and an expansion of our existing centre on Charlotte Street in 2023/2024. We also engaged in a right-sizing exercise of our Frank Rudderham Family YMCA to maximize space within the facility and converted programming space to make room for a new community programming centre coming fall 2023.

Focusing on our People - We grew our staff across all divisions of the Association, from directors to frontline, in an effort to build capacity and capability. Our team worked hard to deliver our mission with operational excellence, and we engaged with them, listened and acted to ensure their voice was part of moving the Association forward. The work of our volunteers was truly inspirational – they continue to give so much of their time and talent to advance our work at our YMCA – thank you!

A culmination of our work in 2022/2023 also enabled our YMCA to open our doors to community like never seen before. Our response to hurricane Fiona was made possible thanks to the strength of our staff and volunteers, the generosity of our partners, as well as our ability to react and willingly serve our community.

As each day passes, we will continue to challenge ourselves with the question "how best can the YMCA serve our community". And as the needs of our community evolve, so too will the work of our YMCA.

Hurricane Fiona Response



A highlight of 2022 was the YMCA of Cape Breton’s community response to Hurricane Fiona. Hours after Hurricane Fiona hit Cape Breton, our YMCA opened our doors to community for free hot showers, meals and hot refreshments along with a place to gather, charge devices and stay warm while most of the municipality experienced extended power outages. Over just one week, 4,000+ visitors walked through the doors at Charlotte Street and Membertou locations with extreme gratitude on being offered some of the most basic necessities at this very difficult time. The staff and volunteers of YCB went above and beyond and instantaneously jumped in to provide support – serving meals, stocking the coffee/tea station,

organizing free community fitness classes, greeting visitors, donating supplies, and providing countless smiles and hugs to visitors. A special thanks to United Way of Cape Breton and Subway for your support during our community response.

Here we GROW AGAIN

As the largest provider of licensed not-for-profit childcare in Canada, the YMCA welcomes opportunities to provide early learning experiences to more children through the expansion of operations and connections in our communities. In 2022/2023, our childcare division was able to expand our services to new communities as well as grow within our existing sites.

AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAMS

We kicked off the new school year with four returning after-school programs in Sydney, Glace Bay and Whitney Pier. We also opened a new site in Port Hawkesbury at the Tamarac Education Centre in September, and a new site in Inverness in January 2023 at the Inverness Education Centre Academy.

The YMCA of Cape Breton has increased access for families to after-school care from 50 spaces last year to over 130 spaces this past school year thanks to an expansion of the program in partnership with the Department of Communities Culture Tourism and Heritage. Our after-school programs offer child-led programming that focus on physical literacy and play-based learning, with a strong emphasis on healthy lifestyles, outdoor play, and active movement. Our programs are safe, fun, accessible and inclusive and are delivered by a dedicated team of staff across the Island.

YMCAs OF NOVA SCOTIA COLLECTIVE

After responding to the provincial expression of interest from the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development in Fall 2021, the YMCA of Cape Breton has been working with YMCAs across Nova Scotia in a collective effort to open hundreds of new childcare spaces between 2023 and 2024.

“In the past year, the YMCA Collective has used a collaborative approach to advocate for the sector, released a best-practice manual for childcare, developed recruitment and retention strategies for ECEs, and implemented accessible training platforms for YMCAs in Nova Scotia,” says Nicole MacDonald, Senior Manager, Childcare Division, YMCA of Cape Breton. Our YMCA will be opening two new childcare centres in 2023/2024 including a 50-space centre at the Cove Guest Home in Sydney, and a 26-space centre in Guysborough. Our existing childcare centre on Charlotte Street will also be expanding with 12 additional toddler spaces in the fall.

EARLY LEARNING CENTRE

The mission of the YMCA of Cape Breton's Early Learning Centre is to provide support to families and to promote the development of the whole child by providing a carefully planned, age appropriate, stimulating, and child-centered play environment.

In 2022/2023, we had the joy of providing care to 74 infants, toddlers, and pre-schoolers. Children experienced countless activities and learnings including sightseeing in downtown Sydney, fun in the YMCA gymnasium and “ball room”, raising supplies for the local SPCA, and a highlight of the year was a story time with YMCA Board Director Jeff Ward. Jeff taught the children and staff some words from the Mi'kmaq language and sang songs with the children while playing his traditional Mi'kmaq drum.

THE Y SAVED MY LIFE

When Robert Zwarun joined the YMCA of Cape Breton, he started a journey that would soon see him not only benefiting from the programs and services of the YMCA but would eventually see himself giving back to the community and Y members.

“Everything that’s happened in the last 10 years is a direct result of my being here at the Y. The YMCA, for all intents and purposes, saved my life, it really did.”

Robert was diagnosed with fetal alcohol syndrome in the early 1990s and then an inherited degenerative condition called ataxia in 2010. Robert shared that symptoms impact his fine motor skills, his balance and his speech.

In 2013 he decided to join the YMCA after a client at the care facility where he was living told him about his own experience as a Y member. Robert notes he was shy and completely withdrawn at the time. After joining the Y, he soon realized he joined a community. Robert made new friends, joined fitness classes in aquatics and yoga, and said his self-esteem increased.

In Fall of 2022, Robert participated in the YMCA of Cape Breton’s Opportunities Fund program and with support from the YMCA Nova Scotia Works team, Robert secured funding to complete training to become a Yoga Instructor. Since spring 2023, Robert has been instructing multiple weekly chair yoga classes at both the Frank Rudderham Family YMCA and the Membertou YMCA.

Robert’s classes are very popular at our YMCA. Group Fitness Coordinator, Colette Sexton, indicates that Robert keeps an open mind and an open heart in his yoga practice – creating spaces that are safe and inclusive for all.

Thank you, Robert, for your dedication and support for YMCA members and their own journeys to health and wellness. You are a true inspiration!

Jennifer enjoyed her volunteer time in the pool so much, that she then connected with our summer camp program and began volunteering to support our campers during their daily visits to the pool.

Jennifer then shared with Julie that she had volunteered at a daycare program in

Julie continued to make connections for Jennifer and eventually introduced her to the local Special Olympics team. Jennifer is now a force on the floor hockey team on Mondays at the YMCA as well as their swim team.

Jennifer’s sister Melanie shared the following with the YMCA, “The power of the YMCA to transform the lives of even the most vulnerable of society, Jennifer included, is so readily apparent. And it makes such a positive difference in our community, in our country, and around the world. But, most importantly, it has provided Jennifer a safe haven, a place to call home, and unconditional love and regard. As much as Jennifer has given to the YMCA, the YMCA has given back to her”.

Connecting People to Jobs, and Jobs to People

Across the YMCA of Cape Breton's Employment Services Division, we deliver programs and services to connect people to jobs and jobs to people.

With seven locations across Cape Breton in 2022/2023, our Employment Services division staff worked tirelessly to connect with each person, employer and partner, to find meaningful and worthwhile employment opportunities for Cape Bretoners and newcomers to Cape Breton.

Our Nova Scotia Works team provide a one-stop shop search and career advice resource, helping Cape Bretoners reach their employment goals. NS Works centres are available to help people explore careers, find a job, create a resume, prepare for an interview, apply for funding to get training, and much more. In 2022/2023 alone, we had over 20,000 clients visit our centres across the Island, and we actively case managed over 6,100 clients – amazing!

Outreach was a priority for our Employment team this past year. Organizing and attending career fairs, visiting rural areas to meet job seekers in their communities, and facilitating over 1,400 free employment workshops in Cape Breton.

Outreach also extended to a number of initiatives and events organized by our Employment staff team to give back to the communities in which they live and work.

Each program has a targeted demographic, but ultimately all have a goal of attaching clients to training and/or employment. In 2022/2023 we had 130 participants engage in these programs.


